



Conflictos Ambientales Anómalos, Débiles y Fuertes: Nuevos Significados y Perspectivas de Justicia

Resumen

El presente artículo proporciona el significado de “conflicto ambiental” e identifica distintos tipos de conflictos ambientales. Estos conflictos también pueden ser descritos como conflictos débiles y fuertes, de los cuales este estudio muestra numerosos ejemplos. Bajo otro aspecto, el presente artículo interpreta los conflictos ambientales como señales de desintegración entre las distintas esferas disciplinarias, que tienden a alejarse una de otra. No pocas veces, los conflictos ambientales son conflictos anómalos, porque inexpresados y oportunistas. La justicia, concebida como una herramienta capaz de resolver estos conflictos, requiere responsabilidad, integridad y conciliación.

Abstract

This paper explains the meaning of “environmental conflict” and identifies several types of environmental conflicts. These conflicts can also be described as weak and strong conflicts, of which this study shows many examples. Under another aspect, this work interprets environmental conflicts as signs of disintegration among the various disciplinary areas, which tend to move away from one another. Not infrequently, environmental conflicts are anomalous conflicts, because they are unexpressed and opportunistic conflicts. Justice, as a tool to resolve these conflicts, requires responsibility, integrity and conciliation.
